December 10 is Human Rights Day, which that commemorates the adoption of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights by the United Nations in 1948.



The UDHR is an expression of the fundamental values shared by members of the international community in recognizing the inherent dignity and rights of all human beings, and is the foundation of freedom, justice and peace throughout the world.

Our world today is seeing significant challenges to human rights, with many experiencing discrimination, racism, violence, and lack of access to necessary resources for health, safety, and wellbeing. This month of recognition also creates an opportunity for us to come together and take a stand for human rights.
