June is Pride Month—a time to honor the LGBTQ+ community's strength, joy, and ongoing fight for equal rights. Pride began with the 1969 Stonewall Uprising, a key moment in LGBTQ+ history that sparked a movement for change. Today, Pride is both a celebration and a reminder that the fight for justice continues, especially as new laws threaten the rights of LGBTQ+ people, particularly trans youth.


